Growing in Unusual Places!

Even though our doors were closed for a while, there were still amazing things happening at Educare DC. Last month, our teachers and students discovered something amazing growing in front of the building in our flower bed - watermelon!

We found six whole watermelons growing in the flower bed near the entrance of the building. Our teachers used this as a wonderful learning opportunity - discussing with their students the different ways that the seeds could have found their way into the flower bed, such as someone eating a slice of

They also picked one of the watermelons to harvest and cut up to eat! The kids determined that the watermelon was not quite ripe and a little tart. Learning Tip of the Month

Help your child find and predict the different patterns around them!

Patterns are all around us - once you start looking for them, you will find them everywhere. There are patterns in colors, shapes, sounds, dances, and even our daily routines. Being able to able to recognize patterns is a skill that translates directly into subjects like science and math - algebraic thinking is one example! By exploring these ideas now, you are setting your child up to succeed in bigger math ideas later.

Young children can explore very simple repeating patterns through simple exercises, such as asking your child to copy patterns that you make, and then you can copy your child's patterns! See below for a few additional exercises:

- Snack Pattern Necklaces use fruit-flavored cereal O's to create a necklace with a specific color pattern. Start simple with two colors repeating and then add more colors for a larger pattern!
- Build Pattern Block Towers use different blocks to create towers, alternating between different shapes or colors. See if you can copy each other's creations!
