

Digging for Worms and Harvesting Veggies!

Last month, as a part of our Early Growers program with our partners at City Blossoms and Mrs. Kelly worked together to hosted a Clean Up Educare Eden Day for our onsite children!

Our young gardeners got their hands nice and dirty, cleaning the raised garden beds by pulling weeds, turning the soil, harvesting some veggies that were leftover from summer, and they decorated the garden tress with patterns of ribbon they put together. As they worked, they learned about preparing the garden for winter and spring and even collected worms!

Once they had finished all their hard work - they were able to take the leftover cherry tomatoes and cucumbers back to their classrooms.

Learning Tip of the Month

Explore **light and sound** with your children! Kids are naturally curious about the sights and sounds around them.

We experience the properties of light and sound every day - the warmth of the sun, shadows and reflections from the light, singing, playing with noisy toys, and so on!

As you explore light and sound with your child, talk with them about their experiences. Use words like bright, brighter and brightest and loud, louder, loudest. Here are some easy ways to explore light and sound at home:

- Have a shadow puppet show: use a lamp and different toys to explore how shadows are cast. Explore questions such as what happens to the shadow the farther away the toy is from the light does it grow? Do the edges of the shadow blur?
- Talk and sing through tubes: you can use toilet paper, paper towel, and wrapping paper tubes. Use the tubes to talk and listen through. Explore questions such as - can we make loud and soft sounds? What happens when we put paper on one side of the tube?

Loud sounds and dark spaces can make our children nervous, but with your support, they can become selfconfident and a safety-conscious explorer!
