### Learning Tip of the Month

#### Investigate temperature with your child!

Temperature may seem like an advanced topic for children, but even young learners can start learning about and measuring temperature!

Start with the simple idea of what is hot and cold - using things around your house to explore this. Kids can "feel" the temperature of ice to demonstrate the cold, or wrap their hands, with your help, around your coffee cup to explain hot.

Once they understand the concept of hot and cold, have your children think about places and objects that have different temperatures around your home and ask questions, such as "why do we put things in the freezer?" or "why do we blow on our food after it has been cooked?". This helps your child build connections of what temperature is and why it is needed.

To explore temperature further, you can even conduct an experiment, such as what happens to water when it gets cold or hot, by putting some water in the freezer, on the counter, and on the stove top. Explore questions and observations such as:

- "Why did the water in the freezer get hard?:
- ""Is there steam from the water on the stove top?"
- "Did anything happen to the water on the counter?"
