
Happy St. Patrick's Day from all of us at Educare DC

Learning Tip of the Month

In honor of Read Across America day being celebrated this month, we encourage everyone to sit a read a book as a family!

Reading early and often not only helps your child's development, but also helps create a lifelong love of reading! It is never too early to begin reading with your child. Reading with your child helps them become a happy and confident reader. Below are some tips to help make reading more engaging and fun for your child:

- **Read with a fun voice:** read to your child with humor and expression by using different voices. This is a fun way to make reading more interesting and helps your child connect emotions with language and tone.
- **Be interactive:** take time to discuss what is happening in the book, such as pointing things out on the page and asking questions.
- **Know when to stop:** it is okay to stop if your child loses interest or has trouble paying attention. Put the book away, and come back to it when your child is ready to read again.
