Mr. Berry began his career with Educare DC in 2013 as an infant and toddler mentor teacher. He earned a Bachelor of Science Degree in Pedology from Bowie State University. At George Washington University, he earned a master's degree in Early Childhood Education and a Specialist of Education degree in Leadership and Early Childhood Special Education.

Outgoing CEO Pyper Davis will step down after more than eight years at the helm. "I am leaving because it is the right transition time for me and for Educare.
