Child Care Partners

The Early Head Start Child Care Partnership is concluding its final year of grant cycle 1. We have seen a lot of progress from our childcare partner sites within their policies, operations, staff retention, and educational practices. Some of the achievements that we are proud of within this grant cycle are as follows: increasing the number of home visits per year to help us build relationships, supporting our partner sites with regular parent meetings and events that engage families, as well as our most recent enrollment data that increased from 53% enrolled to 76% enrolled children Enroll here: and families within a year. We are also very proud that we have enhanced https://www.educaredc.org/enroll/prenatal the buildings of our partner sites by building new playgrounds, installing walls to stop the transfer of sight and sound from one classroom to another-making a less disruptive classroom environment, as well as completing renovations to increase the number of sinks and food preparation stations. We look forward to another five years of the Early Head Start Child Care Partnership (EHS-CCP) grant beginning March 1, 2024, where we plan to continue to improve outcomes by utilizing data and collaborating with our childcare partners in Ward 7 and 8.







We're gearing moms to be up for motherhood. Our Moms 2 Be program hosted its annual baby shower on Dec. 20, where expectant moms were given gifts, support, and a sense of community. It takes a village to raise a child, and our prenatal program is all hands on deck.
