Advocacy & Parent Ambassador Program

Spring is advocacy's high season, and we have been more active than ever before this year! In March, seven parents, Advocacy Manager Adam Barragan-Smith, Parent Advocacy Coordinator Njeri Jenkins-Sutton, and President & CEO testified in the DC Council's Performance Oversight hearings to provide feedback on how various DC agencies serve children, families, and teachers. We will also testify in the Budget Oversight hearings in April to ensure that early childhood programs like the Pay Equity Fund and childcare subsidy are fully-funded.

Child Care Partners

The CCP team began the new grant year with some exciting events to promote early literacy during "Read Across America" Week! Our new grant year began on March 1 for our Early Head Start Child Care Partnership Grant and "Read Across America" week began March 4th. We are now servicing four child care partner sites with 110 children and families. During the week of March 4th our CCP sites had a visit from Blue Sky Puppet Theatre. The puppeteer performed "Rufus," a puppet show about a dog who looked different than other dogs but went to dog school to prove himself. During the puppet show, children engaged in singalongs, learned and displayed appropriate social-emotional skills, as well as met many puppets and the puppeteer. We are looking forward to another five years of the EHS-CCP grant and the continued advancement/enrichment within our program!



Education at IDEA & Parkside

Volunteering is a vital component of Educare DC's program. We would love to have more parent volunteers this month! During March, we celebrated "Read Across America." Parents visited their children's classrooms for read-alouds. We also had parents volunteer to plan and execute Sneaker Balls, which were a success. We would love to see more parents in our classrooms! Volunteering in the classroom requires a background and health check. Parents can also volunteer by participating in program governance. If you are interested in volunteering in your child's classroom, please contact your child's teaching team or your Family Engagement Specialist so we can support you with the next steps.

We are excited for many of our staff to attend the Early Educator Experience DC (EarlyEdX) on Friday, April 5. This event will allow them to connect with other early childhood educators and professionals in DC for learning, networking, advocacy, and celebration. Early EdX is powered by the Bainum Family Foundation and hosted by four practitioner-led organizations — District of Columbia Association for the Education of Young Children, District of Columbia Head Start Association, DC Family Child Care Association, and the Multicultural Spanish Speaking Providers Association.

On March 25th, the Parkside site hosted six early educators and city administrators from Binan, Philippines, and two Teaching Strategies staff from their international department. As a Teaching Strategies ambassador program, we are afforded the opportunity to work alongside a curriculum specialist as well as share our expertise with the Department of Education's team from Binan on curriculum implementation.



Family Engagement

Educare DC hosted its first Kinder School Fair on Friday, February 23, 2024. The purpose of the fair was: to help families understand the difference between Public, Charter, Montessori and Private Schools, assist with narrowing down school choices, and to apply for the lottery on the My School DC website.

We hoped families would be able to speak with elementary school representatives about services offered and schedule tours to get an up close and personal glance at the academic and/or extra-curricular programming. These are the schools that participated: Global Citizens, DC Prep, Burrville, Plummer, Rocketship, Bishop Walker, Brown Education Campus, Two Rivers, C.W. Harris, and Excel Academy. My School DC also participated by assisting families with applying for the lottery.

Family Engagement and Educare DC families from IDEA & Parkside hosted Sneaker Balls on March 1, 2024 & March 5, 2024. Our theme: Sneakers & Snowflakes. This was an opportunity for families and staff to socialize, enjoy music, dancing, and fun activities while showcasing their favorite sneakers.



Recruitment and Enrollment

Re-enrollment for School Year 2024-2025 begins April 1st. This year, we will be using DocuSign to complete registration packets. If a family would like a paper registration packet, they can reach out to their Family Engagement Specialist or a member of the Enrollment Team. Our Pre-K program is not a part of the DC lottery, so families do not need to apply externally.
