#### **Education at IDEA & Parkside**

With the new school year upon us, the Education team at Educare DC is already making impactful strides. Our PK teachers will take part in a General Motors-funded Science Club. They will participate in monthly Community Practice groups on the Early Science Initiative Framework that provides core ideas on scientific engagement and exploration.
